Basic Electricity for the Neophyte

Revised Oct 14, 2001 by **Bob Swanner BASIC ELECTRICITY:** WATTS Law: P = EI OHMS
Law: E = IR where E = Voltage: Electromotive force, Electrical pressure I=Amps: Intensity, current, quantity R = Ohms:
Resistance

Let's equate water & electricity. We CAN see water, but we CAN'T see electricity. Water flows through a pipe, Electricity flows through a wire. Higher water pressure causes more water to flow out of the same size pipe. Higher voltage, electrical pressure, makes more current flow out of a wire.

Quantities of water are measured in Gallons. Quantities of electricity are measured in Amps. What limits the amount of water we get out of our pipe even with high pressure? Resistance caused by the size of pipe. Right! How come? Well if the water pressures were the same how long would it take to fill our swimming pool with a small garden hose? How long would it take to fill our pool from a fire plug using a fire hose? A lot quicker, right? More current, Amps, can flow through a larger wire. Take a look at the size of wire at your car battery then look at wires going to other things. Resistance is what restricts an uncontrolled flow of electricity. Resistance & Amps operate **inversely** like the seesaw, ohms go down amps go up, or vice-versa, with voltage remaining constant as the pivot. All electrical circuits must have their designed-in resistance. The higher a circuit's resistance, the lower its current flow will be. The lower a circuit's resistance, the higher its current flow will be.
