Monthly Railmags Focus On Tennessee Rails By Ralcon Wagner

For several years now, there has been an ongoing discussion (or argument) among southern railfans why national railfan magazines don't cover more articles, features or cover more news about trains or railroads in Dixie. Many felt slighted that the editorial departments of these magazines were insensitive or perhaps even prejudiced to Southerners and their railroads. A valid argument, indeed.

About 18 years ago, I asked the editors of these popular periodicals – such as PTJ's Mike Schafer, R&R's Jim Boyd, and Trains' Dave Ingles if this was the case. All assured me that this was not the case. The answer all three gave was about the same: "Hardly anyone sends us anything. If we get a photo or article covering a Southern subject, we're probably gonna print it, because most of the stuff we get comes from California, the Midwest, or the East. We'd welcome something like that."

There's a lot of merit to that. It's not that there isn't any talent around the South, or even Nashville. Within our own organization, we have a wealth of talent among our members. However, these gifted writers seem to be preoccupied with writing quality technical books about the N&W, L&N, TC or the IC. These fellas shall remain nameless. All kidding aside, what appears in a rail magazine is directly related to what type of material - and the region - is sent in at any given time.

In what may be a "first" historically, Tennessee's railroads will be getting a lot of exposure in two rival railroad magazines' September, 2007 issues. This isn't really a coincidence. The issues of both <u>Trains</u> and <u>Railfan & Railroad</u> will hit subscribers and newsstands in about three weeks – just in time for the 2007 NRHS Convention in Chattanooga in August.

In <u>Trains</u> Magazine, there will be a feature of the Tennessee Valley Railroad, and what is probably more impressive to this writer, a "then-and-now" foldout railroad map of Tennessee. Actually, it is two rail maps of our state – 1949 and 2007. Both were excellently drawn by Kalmbach illustrator Bill Metzger. According to Bill, the 2007 map was much more difficult to create because of all the changes in ownership (and names) of many of the shortlines. It is, by far, the most up-to-date rail map of Tennessee in existence (we did manage to get a sneak peek), even showing the current construction of the N&E RR's spur at Monterey.

Meanwhile, in <u>Railfan and Railroad</u> Magazine, there will be two articles. The first piece will reportedly cover railfanning in Chattanooga and environs by writer Steve Freer. Another piece in the same issue, focusing more on railroad architecture rather than actual trains, will feature gentrified depots of various styles in the region. Eight or nine examples will be featured, including the former L&N depot at Etowah, and the NC&StL station at Cowan – both of these are now rail museums.
