NRHS News By Herb Roth

The National Steel Car company, dba The National Alabama Corp, is building a huge plant - 2 million ft^2 - at Muscle Shoals, AL. They already have about 500 men in plant construction, and when the plant is operational, they will have about 1500 employees. The National Steel Car company has a great website that shows photos of all the rail cars they produce. Modelers should really have a look at this site!

Some interesting, current railroad facts-Regional railroads in 2006 controlled 12 percent of the 140,00 mile U.S. rail network, employed 4 percent of the 187,000 freight rail workforce and generated 3 percent of freight rail's 54 billion revenue dollars. Freight, passenger and commuter railroads dispatch more than 10,000 trains each day in the U.S. Class 1 railroads spent between 15 and 25 percent of all operating costs on fuel in the third quarter of 2007. Nearly one-third of locomotives owned by U.S. railroads are 22 years old or older. 22 percent of the nation's shortline and regional routes are limited to 40 mph, while 32 percent are limited to 25 mph.

Nashville Ntrak Report

Nashville Ntrak returned from Louisville, KY late Sunday night after participating in the National N Scale Convention and World's Greatest Hobby on tour show. While in Louisville we were part of a record-setting Ntrak layout that included 701 modules from many Ntrak clubs from around the country and some modules and participants from outside of the United States. Setup for this layout began Wednesday morning at 6:00 am and concluded Friday night at midnight. In between we worked for three very long 18-hr days with many model railroaders that we had never met before. It was truly an amazing experience to meet so many wonderful people with a common interest in railroads and work with them to put together such a huge layout. Here are a few brief statistics: Layout size - 55,000 square feet (1.26 acres) Total number of Ntrak modules - 701 Mainline length in actual feet - 3,810 feet Mainline length in scale miles - 115.5 scale miles Approximate time to run around the layout once - 3 to 4 hours

Upcoming Nashville Ntrak events include the Smyrna Library layout on July 18-20, the Viola Homecoming on August 9, CSX Family Days on August 16, and Thomas the Tank Engine at the TCRM on August 30-31 and September 6-7. We hope to see many of you there!
