Upcoming TCRM Projects

We have plans for several projects that will involve volunteer participation and funding. We will be using some of our proceeds from our Thomas event as a source of revenue to support these projects.

Rehab power car TCRX 1354- This was our first power car that we purchased from Amtrak years ago and was originally a US Army kitchen car. It is not a stainless car and has a considerable amount of rust in the sides. Our power cars are the lifeblood of the train. This power car has two generator sets in it and is the back up to our stainless steel 514 power car. Plans are to reseal the roof of the car, sheet the sides of the car with stainless steel after the rust areas are removed so it will have the same appearance as the TCRX 1266 baggage car. In addition some improvements will be made inside and some truck work will be done.

Dome car TCRX 9400- 9400 has a severe case of water leaking around the dome area and getting into the hallway downstairs. Not an expensive item to fix with RTV but very labor intensive to remove the old caulk and re-caulk the dome seams. Concrete Extension- We are pricing out what the cost would be of extending the concrete workpad between the Museum platform track and Sou Jct Yard track #1 going west from the enginehouse for a better work area.

Wheels- We will be doing some wheel changes in early 2010 on two of our excursion cars. This is not only a labor intensive project but very expensive as well. A used axle with new wheels installed and re-qualified bearings are \$5,000.00 each and that does not include shipping each way.

Washing exterior of the cars- This is very overdue on certain cars. This is not a costly task but again a labor intensive one. We need to set aside a date to wash several of our cars. Please see myself or Bob if you will help with this.
